INTRODUCTION

At the AGM to be held at Suites 903-905, 9th Floor, Shui On Centre, 6-8 Harbour Road, Wan Chai, Hong Kong on Friday, 24 August 2018 at 10:00 a.m., resolutions will be proposed, among other matters:

- (a) to grant the General Mandate to the Directors;
- (b) to grant the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors;

- (c) to increase the number of Shares to be allotted and issued under the General Mandate by an additional number representing such number of Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate; and
- (d) to re-elect the Directors.

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information in relation to the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM for the grant of the General Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate and the extension of the General Mandate, the re-election of Directors and to give you the notice of the AGM to seek your approval of the relevant ordinary resolution relating to these matters at the AGM.

GENERAL MANDATE AND REPURCHASE MANDATE

General Mandate

On 19 December 2017, an ordinary resolution was passed by all the then Shareholders to give a general mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to allot, issue and deal with Shares. Such general mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. It is therefore proposed to renew such general mandate at the AGM. General Mandate will be proposed at the AGM to grant a general mandate to the Directors to allot, issue and otherwise deal with additional Shares not exceeding 20% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of passing General Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company had in issue an aggregate of 800,000,000 Shares. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution for the approval of the General Mandate and in accordance with the terms therein, the Company would be allowed under the General Mandate to allot, issue and deal with, up to a maximum of 160,000,000 Shares, representing 20% of the total number of issued Shares at the time of the passing of the resolution approving the General Mandate on the basis that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM.

The Directors have no immediate plans to issue any new Shares other than Shares which may fall to be issued under the share option scheme of the Company or any scrip dividend scheme as may be approved by the Shareholders.

Repurchase Mandate

On 19 December 2017, an ordinary resolution was passed by all the then Shareholders to give a general mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase its own Shares. Such general mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the AGM. It is therefore proposed to renew such general mandate at the AGM. The Shares which may be repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate shall not exceed 10% of total number of issued shares of the Company as at the date of passing of resolution approving the Repurchase Mandate.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

Under the Listing Rules, the Company is required to give to the Shareholders all information which is reasonably necessary to enable Shareholders to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolution to renew the grant to the Directors of the Repurchase Mandate. The explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be included in this circular is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

Subject to the passing of the resolution for the approval of the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 80,000,000 Shares.

An ordinary resolution will also be proposed at the AGM in relation to the extension of the general mandate to be granted to the Directors to allot, issue, and otherwise deal with additional Shares under the General Mandate by adding to it the number of shares which the Company repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate, if any. The Directors have no present intention to fully exercise the Repurchase Mandate for repurchasing the Shares.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

The board of Directors currently comprises six Directors, of which two are executive Directors, namely Mr. Lo Wing Cheung and Ms. Fung Pik Mei; one is a non-executive Director, Mr. Wan Ho Yin and three are independent non-executive Directors, namely Mr. Shu Wa Tung Laurence, Mr. Tam Wai Tak Victor and Mr. Tam Wing Lok.

According to Article 16.2, any Director appointed by the Board either to fill a casual vacancy or as an addition to the existing Board shall hold office only until the next following general meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re-election. Accordingly, Mr. Lo Wing Cheung, Ms. Fung Pik Mei, Mr. Wan Ho Yin, Mr. Shu Wa Tung Laurence, Mr. Tam Wai Tak Victor and Mr. Tam Wing Lok shall retire from their offices as Directors. This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide requisite information to you for your consideration of the Repurchase Mandate.

1. REPURCHASE OF SECURITIES FROM CORE CONNECTED PERSONS

The Listing Rules prohibit a company from knowingly purchasing securities on the Stock Exchange from a “core connected person”, that is, a director, chief executive or substantial shareholder of the Company or any of its subsidiaries or their respective close associates and a core connected person is prohibited from knowingly selling his/her/its securities to the Company.

No core connected person of the Company has notified the Company that he/she/it has a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company nor has any such core connected person undertaken not to sell any of the Shares held by him/her/it to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is passed.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 800,000,000 fully-paid Shares.

Subject to the passing of the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are to be issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 80,000,000 fully-paid Shares representing not more than 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date.

3. REASONS FOR THE REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that the granting of the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole. An exercise of the Repurchase Mandate may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, repurchases would be funded entirely from the Company’s available cash flow or working capital facilities which will be funds legally available under the Cayman Islands law and the Articles of Association for such purpose.

In the event that the Directors should exercise the power to repurchase Shares under the Repurchase Mandate in full, the shareholding of the controlling shareholders will be increased to approximately 81.7% of the issued share capital of the Company.

In the event the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares which is proposed to be granted pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, the interests of the controlling shareholders in the Company would be increased to approximately 81.7%. He is primarily responsible for the Group’s overall management, strategic planning and business development activities. Under the management of Mr. Lo, the Group gradually expanded its business and became engaged as the main supplier of building materials to many significant residential and commercial developments in Hong Kong over the past three decades.

According to a service contract entered into between Mr. Lo and the Company, Mr. Lo’s term of appointment shall be initially for a fixed term of three (3) years commencing from 17 January 2018 and shall continue thereafter, unless terminated by not less than three months’ notice given by either party. Mr. Lo’s appointment shall be subject to retirement and re-election in the annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the Articles of Association and the Listing Rules. Mr Lo is currently entitled to an annual salary of HK\$1,020,000, housing benefit and a performance related bonus for each financial year, which was determined by the Board with reference to the recommendation of the remuneration committee of the Company (the “**Remuneration Committee**”) and subject to review by the Remuneration Committee.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Lo is deemed to be interested in 588,000,000 Shares held by Helios Enterprise Holding Limited within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Saved as disclosed above, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Lo (i) did not hold other positions with the Company and other members of the Group; (ii) did not hold other directorship in any public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the past three years; (iii) did not hold any other major appointments and professional qualifications; (iv) does not have any relationship with other Directors, senior management, substantial and/or controlling shareholders of the Company and (v) did not have any interests in shares of the company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Save as disclosed above, there is no further information required to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of Rule 13.51(2) of Listing Rules and there are no other matters relating to the re-election of Mr. Lo that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Ms. Fung Pik Mei (馮碧美) (“**Ms. Fung**”), aged 57, a controlling shareholder of the Company, has been an executive Director since 22 June 2017. She is also directors of certain subsidiaries of the Company. Ms. Fung joined the Group as a director of Kwan Tai Engineering Co., Limited (one of the Group’s subsidiaries) in 1997 and is responsible for

overseeing the day-to-day business operations of the Group, in particular the supervision of the Group's project management team. Having been involved in the management of the Group for over 20 years, she has gathered extensive expertise within the industry, businesses of the Group and project management for all of the Group's operations. Ms. Fung attended her secondary education in Hong Kong until 1979. She is the spouse of Mr. Lo and the mother of Ms. Lo Pui Ying Janice.

According to a service contract entered into between Ms. Fung and the Company, Ms. Fung's term of appointment shall be initially for a fixed term of three (3) years commencing from 17 January 2018 and shall continue thereafter, unless terminated by not less than three months' notice given by either party. Ms. Fung's appointment shall be subject to retirement and re-election in the annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the Articles of Association and the Listing Rules. Saved as disclosed above, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Fung (i) did not hold other positions with the Company and other members of the Group; (ii) did not hold other directorship in any public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the past three years; (iii) did not hold any other major appointments and professional qualifications; (iv) does not have any relationship with other Directors, senior management, substantial and/or controlling shareholders of the Company and (v) did not have any interests in shares of the company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. Save as disclosed above, there is no further information required to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules and there are no other matters relating to the re-election of Ms. Fung that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS

Mr. Wan Ho Yin (溫浩然) ("Mr. Wan"), aged 40, was appointed as a non-executive Director since 22 June 2017 and is mainly responsible for advising the internal audit function of the Group and performing independent appraisal of the adequacy and effectiveness of the Group's risk management and internal control systems. He is also a member of the Audit Committee of the Board. Mr. Wan graduated with a Bachelor degree of Business Administration in Accounting from the Hong Kong Baptist University in 1999. He is a member of Hong Kong Society of Accountants (now known as Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants) and a member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants since 2003. He has over 16 years of experience in audit and financial management. Since September 2014, he has been in the role of chief financial officer and company secretary of Man King Holdings Limited (Stock code: 2193), a listed company on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange.
